

**FARM PRODUCTS
DEPARTMENT G
RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. Department is open to residents of all counties as space permits.
2. Each entry must be plainly labeled as to name of variety and strain by exhibitor.
3. Unless otherwise noted, all products exhibited must have been grown in the current season.
4. Entry fee will be 10% of the first place premium
5. **Premiums: 1st - \$3 2nd - \$2 3rd - \$1 unless otherwise stated**

SECTION 1 – SEEDS

1. Entries must have been grown in the current or preceding crop year with the year stated on the exhibitor's tag.
2. The following factors will be considered:
 - Purity of the seed.
 - Cleanliness.
 - Freedom from weeds.
 - Uniformity
 - Trueness to type.
 - Moisture content
 - Free of disease.

POTATOES – 8 tubers

Premiums – 1st \$4.50 2nd - \$3 3rd - \$1.50

9. White varieties: Chippewa, Katahdin, Kennebec, Superior, etc.
10. Red Varieties: (including those with red or pink skin or pinkeyes) Pontiac, Norland, etc.
11. Russet varieties: Russet Burbank, Belchip, Belrus, etc.
12. Cobbler varieties: Irish, Eureka, Potentate, etc.

SECTION 2 – SHEAVES & STALKS

SHEAVES

Must be tied tightly by two bands and must measure at least four inches diameter at the lower band.

STALKS

23. Field Corn – 3 stalks – roots wrapped to keep plants moist
24. Soybeans on plant – 6 stalks
25. Sunflowers – 3 heads on 18 inches of stalk – tied

SECTION 3 – HAY & SILAGE

HAY

Each entry shall consist of one bale – tied. Judged on leafiness, color, smell, free from mold and weeds.

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| 26. Alfalfa first cutting | 30. Grass hay – first cutting |
| 27. Alfalfa – later cutting | 31. Grass hay – later cutting |
| 28. Clover – first cutting | 32. Mixed legume – grass – first cutting |

SECTION 4 – VEGETABLES

To be judged on quality, uniformity in size & shape, cleanliness, color, maturity, best market size

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| 38. Beans–green snap– ¼ inch stem, 12 pods | 52. Garlic – 3 clusters |
| 39. Beans-yellow snap- ¼ inch stem, 12 pods | 53. Lettuce – roots off – 1 plant |
| 40. Beans – Pole- ¼ inch stem, 12 pods | 54. Onions – trim roots to ¾ inch – 5 bulbs |
| 41. Beans – Horticultural – ¼ inch stem, 12 pods | 55. Peas – ¼ inch stem, 12 pods |
| 42. Beets – tops trimmed to 1-2 inches, 5 | 56. Peppers – 3 |
| 43. Broccoli – 1 head | 57. Radish – tops trimmed to 1 inch, 7 |
| 44. Brussel sprouts – one quart | 58. Pumpkin – 1 |
| 45. Cabbage – 1 head | 59. Rhubarb – 5 stalks |
| 46. Carrots – tops trimmed to 1 inch, 5 | 60. Squash – summer – 3 |
| 47. Cauliflower – 1 head | 61. Squash- winter – 1 |
| 48. Chard – one plant-roots off | 62. Tomatoes – green-stems removed –5 |
| 49. Corn – sweet – 3 ears | 63. Tomatoes – green – stems removed – 5 |
| 50. Cucumbers – slicing – 3 | 64. Tomatoes – small fruiting – 1 cluster |
| 51. Cucumbers – small pickling – 9 | 65. Turnips – tops trimmed to ½ inch – 3 |
65. Any other vegetable not listed

SECTION 5 – EXHIBITS

66. **Home Garden** – 6 kinds of vegetables of same number as individual classes. No potatoes. Vegetables may not compete in individual classes and will be judged on same basis plus attractiveness of exhibit. **Premiums: 1ST - \$10 2ND - \$8 3RD - \$6 4TH - \$4**
67. **Potato Contest** – 20 tubers of any variety.

SECTION 6 – OTHER AGICULTURAL PRODUCTS

Christmas Trees – 5 to 8 foot range – trimmed with a minimum of 10 inches from the bottom of the trunk to the lowest branch with tree stand. **Premiums: 1st \$10 2nd \$7 3rd \$4**

68. Balsam and Fraser Fir only

69. All other fir varieties

70. Spruce – all varieties

71. Pine – all varieties

72. Wreaths – undecorated – 12 inch rings only. Foliage must be all the same evergreen – pine, spruce or fir only, excluding princess pine.

Maple Products – **Premiums: 1st \$10 2nd \$7 3rd \$4**

73. Maple syrup – quart size

74. Maple sugar – ½ pound package

75. Maple cream – ½ pound container

Honey Products – **Premiums: 1st \$3 2nd \$2 3rd \$1**

76. Jar – 1 pound – any variety

77. Comb Honey – 4 inch square package

78. Beeswax – ½ pound or more
